Project Highlights

- \$400,000 project - part of \$1.3 million contract
- Awarded to CPM Constructors from Freeport, ME
- Repairs due to over-height vehicle bridge hit
- Work includes heat straightening and structural steel repairs
- Bridge to be closed for up to 60 consecutive days
- Closure tentatively scheduled to begin on July 12, 2021
- Detour route will be signed during closure

This project includes repairs to the Grove Street Bridge that crosses over the Maine Turnpike at Mile 83.7 in the Town of Sabattus.

Due to an over-height vehicle hitting the bridge, repairs to the girders are necessary. This will require removal of damaged portions, heat straightening of other structural steel and potential deck repairs.

During the repairs, the Grove Street Bridge will be closed to traffic for up to 60 days. The closure is tentatively scheduled to begin on Monday, July 12, 2021. During the closure a detour route will be signed.

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Grove Street Detour Route



Approximately 3,200 vehicles travel over the mainline of the Maine Turnpike on Grove Street daily. Traffic will be routed around the construction site via a detour using Crowley Road, Middle Road and Sabattus Street. The detour as signed is approximately 10 miles long from one side of the bridge to the other.
